Q That is about six or seven in the wire room?

A Yes, sir.

Q How many people worked there? A Well, two or

Q So am I correct that somewhere between 30 and 35 people had access to those documents in the code room and adjoining room that you have just described?

A Well, I think that is a reasonable assumption.
