Letter to Director

May 14, 1942

Concerning himself, WHITTAKER CHAMBERS advised that he had studied in Berlin and Brussels and had never been in Russia. At the conclusion of this interview the possibility of contacting CHAMBERS again in the future was discussed and this subject seemed to be in full accord. He was advised that it might be deemed appropriate to secure more detailed information on one or more parts of his above discussion but it is pointed out that this individual left the Party in 1937 and most of his information is either history, hypothesis or deduction. He pointed out that the Party Organization was built upon the theory that individuals in the Party should be kept ignorant of the general theme of activities and that there were continual shifts in Party procedure and theory for which reason he is unable to be more definite in his statements.
