Q (Cont'g) Now, will you tell the Grand Jury of your conclusion in examining the typing appearing on that document and on the documents that were received from Whittaker Chambers on November 17? A I reached the conclusion that the type-

writing appearing on my letter K-32, the "Description of personal characteristics of Timothy Hobson," was typed on the same machine which was used to type the 64 questioned typewritten documents.

BY THE JURY:

Q And also this other letter? A Yes, sir, K-17.

Q Are there any characteristics which a layman -- I mean, you could point out to us, that are similar? A If I had the use of the blackboard, I would be glad to demonstrate.

Q There is one right there. A All right. I'll magnify these characteristics by drawing them a little larger than they can actually be. The lower righthand side of the small letter "g"; there is a defect appearing at the point that I have indicated right here. Under the microscope, of course, that shows up very clearly. But that is probably caused -- I just say "probably"; I don't know -- but maybe when the arm came up at some time it hit another arm of another letter, or else it was hit by something else. At least, this defect appears on the letter "g." That was one characteristic that I noted. And another characteristic, of course, this is greatly magnified, by the ending stroke of the small letter "e," instead of proceeding around in the normal manner,
