Q And what is the FBI listing of that letter addressed to Mr. Tibbetts? Have you got a listing on that? A Yes, sir, and that is listed as K-17.

Q Now, Mr. Feehan, in connection with your examination, will you tell the Grand Jury as to what conclusion you came as to the typewriting which appears on this letter addressed to Mr. Tibbetts and dated January 30, 1933, and the document which Mr. Chambers turned over at the pre-trial hearing on November 17? A I reached the conclusion that the letter beginning "Dear Walter" and which I have designated as K-17 was typed on the same machine which typed the 64 documents which I have referred to as Q-6 through Q-69.

Q Now, will you briefly tell the Grand Jury what efforts were made by you to determine the probable make and year of the typewriter which typed these documents?

A Well, in the Federal Bureau of Investigation, the laboratory section, we have a list of standards maintained there of typewriters of various kinds. The typewriting appearing on the questioned evidence which was submitted to me and which I have listed as Q-6 through Q-69 I studied and compared with these standards, and the questioned typewritten most closely matches the standards for a Woodstock pica typewriter. That's a Woodstock machine with the letters spaced ten letters to the inch.
