He testified before the House Committee, and his testimony appears in a published book so that you can see for a long period of time both before and after this indictment the defendant has had ample opportunity to prepare his case. He knows almost to the nth degree what Mr. Chambers is going to testify to, almost to the nth degree. I daresay that they have everything that we have except photographs of some of the agents who worked on the case.

Now, when you have heard all of this testimony I want you then to go back and consider your oath that you took yesterday and see on which side the truth lies. I want you to examine Chambers. I want you to listen attentively; watch his conduct on the stand; watch the color of his face; watch the way his features move, because if you don't believe Chambers then we have no case under the federal perjury rule, as Judge Kaufman will tell you, where you need one witness plus corroboration, and if one of the props goes out goes the case.

So, watch Mr. Chambers. I daresay he will be on the stand for some time, because Mr. Stryker will probably cross-examine him for a long time. The Government welcomes, actually welcomes, a searching cross-examination, because that is the way you are going to find out where the truth is, not vilification but just
