

Q Now, on your visits to the 30th Street house in this period we are covering from January, 1937 to the summer of 1937, did you ever spend the night there?

A That is the point which I was not clear about. I may have on several occasions, but as I cannot recall that lay-out, I cannot be quite sure.

Q Was Timmy there on any of those occasions?

A Yes, I think he was. I am trying to picture him. Whereas I see him very plainly at P Street, I don't recall him on 30th Street so well. But there was a point at which Timmy had some kind of accident, and I think that occurred at the 30th Street house.

Q What sort of an accident was that?

A He was riding his bicycle, and either ran into a truck, or was frightened by a truck and fell off and hurt himself.

Q What do you remember about that? Was the subject mentioned, or what do you recall about it?

A The subject was certainly mentioned, and I think I have told you what I recall about it.

Q Do you remember seeing Timmy on the occasion or

shortly after his accident?

A I believe I did.

Q Well, do you have any definite recollection one way or the other?

A Yes, some part of him was bandaged, as nearly as I recall, but I have forgotten whether he hurt his arm or his leg.

Q And you recall seeing him at the 30th Street house on some occasion when he had a bandage on?

A If this occurred in 30th Street, otherwise, it would have been in Volta Place.

Q You are not sure as to the date?

A I am not definitely sure.

Q Now, can you remember anything else about Timmy during that period?

A I don't think so.

Q On your visits to the 30th Street house from January to the summer of 1937, did you have any conversations with the Hisses, apart from this business of collecting documents that you have mentioned?

A We certainly had many conversations.
